The Prattley Electric AutoDrafter is operated by electric motors powered by a 12volt battery, and will operate on a fully charged battery for a full day. The design eliminates the need to have left or right handed crates. The rear gates have vertical rollers which allow the gates to roll around the sheep as they close or allow the following sheep to pull back without getting caught.

SPRAY-TOPPING PASTURES

Spray topping pastures in a useful method to control pesky annual grasses, including silver grass, brome grass, barley grass and annual ryegrass. Pasture topping involves applying a non-selective herbicide at flowering/seed setting to reduce viable seed formation. This eliminates the addition of grass weed seeds to the seedbank, resulting in reduced weed population the following year. A secondary advantage of spray topping includes preventing maturity and development of unpalatable dry feed with low nutritive value. Successful spray topping involves planning and attention to detail, keep the following in mind:

Herbicide application:

Two herbicides are registered for spray topping pastures, being glyphosate and paraquat. Phenological stage of the target species determines which chemical will be most suitable for the application. As glyphosate should be sprayed between seed head emergence and before milkydough stage. This chemical is slower acting compared to paraquat as it needs time to translocate through the plant. Thus, glyphosate shouldn't be applied after milky-dough stage as it won't work quickly enough to sterilise the seeds before they mature. Also, glyphosate is very damaging to legume seed set when applied

early-mid flowering compared to paraquat.

Paraquat is a contact herbicide which readily burns what it touches. Paraquat can be applied at a later phenological stage, being from milky-dough to soft-dough stage. The benefit of this is allowing longer for pasture legumes to set seed before spray application.

Timing:

It can be hard to determine when to apply the herbicide as in most pasture situations there will be a mixture of species which mature at different times. Thus, pick the species of the highest concern and tailor the spray application to that. Alternatively, two applications can be made. For example, one pass early to target an earlier maturing species like barley grass and a pass a few weeks later targeting

late-maturing ryegrass. Once again, consider the phenological stage of the pasture legumes when using this double spray strategy as their seed-set will be more effected.

Overall, for best results:

- Graze the paddock well in spring then remove the stock 2-3 weeks prior to spraying to stimulate even emergence of seed heads.
- Spray the grasses at the appropriate timing and with the suitable herbicide and rate.
- Abide by the grazing with-holding period before re-stocking the paddock. Re-stocking the
- paddock will allow any uncontrolled weeds to be chewed off.

Hay freezing:

Hay freezing involves using a nonselective herbicide (glyphosate or paraquat) at a higher rate then what is used for spray-topping to desiccate all plants and weeds together at flowering. Obviously, the issue with this is that pasture legume seed set will be highly affected, but it is still an effective practice for weed control.

EID TAGS

In September 2022, federal and state agriculture ministers in principle to work with industry to work towards implementing a national individual electronic identification (eID) system for sheep and farmed goats by 1st January 2025.

On June 8th, 2023 the State Government announced the key dates and an associated \$9.3 million funding package, to assist producers and the broader industry start the transition towards mandatory sheep and goat eID in South Australia by January 2025.

The initial funding package includes:

- A 50% per eID tag/device rebate in FY2023-24 and FY202425 for new born lambs and kids
- A 75% rebate on essential infrastructure required for the implementation od eID across the supply chain.



Key Dates:

- **1 January 2025:** All sheep and managed goats born on or after this date will require an eID device before leaving their birth property. Sheep and managed goats born before 1st January 2025 do not need eID to be sold during 2025-2026.
- **1 January 2027:** All sheep and managed goats leaving property, irrespective of age will require an eID device.
- **Tag Rebate:** Designed for breading stock that will be retained to avoid double handling post 1 January 2027. Terminal lambs and kids do not need an eID device for the next 2 years (only after 1 January 2025)
